Let us look back at the highlights and the contributions that each and every one of us gathered today have made to make the impossible possible. The year started with a three years strategic planning where there was an overwhelming show of support from all in attendance.




The direction of difficult years, programs and projects aligned with our new vision, mission, and goals. After the strategic planning, PHAP conducted its annual meeting with the volunteer Corps composed of doctors, dentists, and allied professionals.

Because of our volunteers, we can reach more people in our communities in need of our assistance.



Take, for example, our program on sustainable healthcare and adopt Agita community are the geographically isolated and disadvantaged area. We have conducted a coordination meeting with the municipal health officer of San Emilio is off once in July.

We discuss the activity in the pipeline for oral health, the lecture on HIV, and teenage pregnancy and the presentation of the outcomes to the Municipal mayor of San Emilio.



We aspire to continue our program in the communities since they are commonly fifth class municipalities that have limited resources in health. For our operation quick disaster response several calls for support were sent out to the members in response. Members in response to the series of strong earthquakes that hit our country.



PHAP cares conducted relief distribution to 2000 families in Del Carmen Siargao, a province of Surigao Del Norte down south conducted by its local government unit on May 2 following the 5.2 magnitude earthquake that struck the island.



Meanwhile, our members and other partners are also active in our medicine donation program. There are so many recipients of various Nations ranging from vitamins, ointments, skin cream to alcohol.



On July 27, a magnitude 7.3 earthquake occurred in Lagayan, Abra. The earthquake affected areas in Abra and began in a sore and several part of Ifugao. All these were up north of the Philippines.



We have cares to donate chocolate drinks, sleeping mats and alcohol to the affected families through the diocese of Bangued in the province of Abra on August 4th, we received an outpouring of support from our members in terms of monetary and in-kind contributions for the earthquake affected communities.



With the support of our member companies, the foundation went back to the province of Abra up north in early August to donate the much-needed brackets, mosquito nets, used tarpaulins and chocolate drinks to the diocese of Bangued.



We maximize the visit in the north by also conducting a lecture on HIV and feeding each pregnancy in Barangay.

The lecture was presented by the former San Lazaro Hospital director Dr. Benito, San Lazaro Hospital is the National Referral Center for Infectious Diseases.



A series of coordination meetings were held with the Department of Education biggest disaster risk reduction management coordinators and their secondary schools in response to the requests for the conduct of the earthquake and landslides search and rescue orientation course or else all.



The requests for else all, A training program in partnership with the Metro Manila Development Authorities Public Safety Division came following the magnitude seven earthquake that struck the mountainous province of Abra which left a trail of destruction in nearby Ilocos and its contiguous provinces specific to El Salvador.



I am pleased to inform you that we have signed a memorandum of agreement with the Metropolitan Manila Development Authority.

The MOA will allow the MDA and PHAP care so highness our respective resources and networks to build the community of responders within individual companies and several partners and communities nationwide.



Our League of Corporate Foundations partner Aboitiz Foundation donated hundreds of boxes of chocolate drinks that we have cares. This entire year, donated to numerous fund beneficiaries. At a glance, here are our accomplishments over the years.



We have donated over a billion worth of medicines from the year 2003 to the present. 10,000 individuals benefited from our medical outreach programs.

This will be translated to 5000 families, which we were able to reach from 2016 to the present.



We also have 564 certified responders trained from the earthquake and landslides search and rescue orientation course from 2016 to the present.



And we will not rest campaign initiative during this pandemic, which meant we were able to give 8.6 million pesos worth of PPE.

And these are provided to 38 government and private hospitals, NGOs and healthcare institutions.



For our Good Medicine Donation Practices Handbook, we were able to copyright and distribute this on members as a guide for a good medicine donation practice.



We are proud to announce that PHAP cares is the first among the foundations to become a member of the Alliance for Healthy Cities as recognized by the World Health Organization.



We have conducted an oral health program to 157 kinder pupils until grade fourth from all schools of San Emilio Ilocosor which is Ajita community.



As you see the end of the pandemic, we also want to be remembered for our corporate social responsibility work.



We have cares in the recap of our pandemic response for the past two years alongside with other programs of people cares on appears on the webinar with BusinessMirror. BusinessMirror being one of the largest circulating newspapers in the Philippines.
